In the great blizzard in Erie County, New York last week-- during the night, a man (Jay Withey) was stranded in his truck, as he tried to get to a friend who was stranded in a vehicle. Fearing for his life, he knocked on the doors of several houses, offering \$500 to be able to just sleep on the floor. He was denied entry at each house. He then broke into a heated school and then went back outside (a real life Good Samaritan) to save more than 20 people, by bringing them into the heated school. He said that if one of the several households had taken him in, he would not have saved those 20 people. Those households were willing to send the man into the blizzard and sure death, rather than to help him. As Joseph said to his brothers in the Old Testament, "You meant it for evil, but God meant it for good!" Always believe and have faith in God!
