Bills paid this week:

✓ **Shepherd's Care/ Earthquake Relief:** The parish sent \$500.00 to the Diocese from our checking account.

Total bills paid this week: \$500.00. Total collected this week: \$1,795.00. We had a surplus this week of \$1,295.00 For the Fiscal Year, which began September 1, 2022, we have <u>a surplus now of \$6779.94</u> in 23 weeks. Our spectrum of donations on a regular basis runs from \$3.00 per week to \$160.00 per week. The parishioners giving toward the higher end of the range are not necessarily the wealthiest, but they have made a commitment to God to give back a larger portion of their finances. It all belongs to God anyway. God says in Proverbs; Chapter 3, verse 9: "Honor the Lord with thy substance, of all thine increase, and with your first fruits". This is a command, not a request, from God!

What are the nine choirs of angels? God created the angels with a heavenly hierarchy. What is the structure of that hierarchy?

- 1. Seraphim: These angels are the ones closest to God. St. Bernard of Clairvaux says that "God, who is Love, has so drawn and assimilated them to Himself, so filled them with the ardor of affection that burns in Himself" that they seem to be one with Him.
- 2. Cherubim: The prophet Ezekiel describes them as having four wings and four faces. Their four-faced representation signifies God's omniscience. They have profound knowledge of divine secrets.
- 3. Thrones: They reflect God's power, stability, and judgment. Being subservient to their Lord, the Thrones display special characteristics of submission and peace, and are involved in judgments and decrees.
- 4. Dominations: They govern the cosmos and oversee the angels who are directly responsible for administering creation. They mediate God's supreme power over the universe, and appoint the things which are to be done according to his ministrations.
- 5. Virtues: This choir wields "raw power" over the physical elements of our world, creating what we perceive as miracles.
- 6. Powers: These angels protect God's creation from hostile forces; that is, they protect the very laws of creation from God's enemies. They repel hostile powers and constrain evil spirits.
- 7. Principalities: They guard people and nations and are believed to aid the spiritual life and structure of the Church.
- 8. Archangels: They protect countries, dioceses, religious communities and persons such as the Pope, who have monumental responsibilities.
- 9. Angels: This choir is the one most immediately engaged with the activities of human beings. The name "angel" means "messenger" or "one sent". Guardian angels come from this choir, though not every spirit in this choir is necessarily a personal guardian.

Church Etiquette: Below are listed some things that you should adhere to at church:

- 1. Bathroom: Many people drive long distances or have little children. While not always possible, please use the conference room bathroom before Liturgy or after. It is a distraction to the Liturgy to have people walking through the sacristy. If you need to use the conference room bathroom, please use one of the church entrances/exits and enter by the church office door. The doors to the hall will be open during Liturgy, so folks can also use the hall bathrooms, if they can navigate the stairs. Also, the outside doors to the hall will be open for those who cannot navigate the stairs.
- 2. Please do not come into the sacristy area before Liturgy. If you need to tell something to the priest, email or call, otherwise wait until Liturgy is over. There are preparations going on for the service and people entering the sacristy causes distraction.
- 3. We are doing a good job of putting the booklets with the binders facing up in the pew holders. Please return all bulletins and papers that you are not taking home to the place you pick them up in the rear of the church.
- **4.** If you are bringing bread for a memorial, please let Father Dennis know in advance so he will not have to prepare the antidiron. Also, please bring it no later than a half hour of the start of the Liturgy, so that there is not a rush to properly display it.
- **5.** If we have a procession, it should be done silently and with reverence. There should be no talking.
- **6.** For the Little and Great Entrances, please get the fans, candles, and crosses well before we start, so there is not a rush to get them, line up properly, and be ready when the priest comes out of the Holy Place to start.
- 7. When you enter the church before Liturgy, you should be silent. Socializing should take place after Liturgy. Be aware if anyone is trying to pray, and if so, please move the conversation after Liturgy outside or to the conference room.
