Sanctuary Lamp: The lamp will be illuminated in the month of October for the repose of the soul of Mary Facas, the loving mother of Gloria Jeffords; requested by Gloria and John Jeffords.

What is the Miraculous Medal? This medal, also known as the Medal of Our Lady of Graces, is a devotional medal, the design of which was originated by Saint Catherine Laboure, following the apparitions of the Theotokos in a chapel in Paris, France.

Saint Catherine stated that on July 18, 1830, she woke up after hearing the voice of a child calling her to the chapel. She heard the voice of Mary say to her, "God wishes to charge you with a mission. You will be contradicted, but do not fear; you will have the grace to do what is necessary. Tell your spiritual advisor all that passes within you. Times are evil in France and in the world".

On November 27, 1830, Catherine reported that the Theotokos returned to the chapel. She displayed herself in an oval frame, standing on a globe. She wore many rings with gems that shone rays of light over the globe. Around her were appeared the words, in French, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee".

As Catherine watched, the frame seemed to rotate, showing a circle of 12 stars, a large letter "M" surmounted by a cross and a stylized Sacred Heart of Jesus, crowned with thorns, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary pierced with a sword. Asked why some of the gems did not shed light, Mary reportedly said, "Those are the graces for which people forget to ask". Sister Catherine then heard Mary ask her to take the images to her father confessor, telling him that they should be put on medallions, and saying, "All who wear this medal will receive great graces".

Sister Catherine did so, and after two years of investigation and observation of her ordinary, daily behavior, the priest took the information to his archbishop without revealing her identity. The request was approved and medals were designed by and produced through goldsmith Adrien Vachette.

Pope John Paul II used a slight variation of the reverse image of the medal as his coat of arms. It consisted of the Marian Cross, a plain cross with an "M" underneath the right hand bar (which signified the Blessed Virgin at the foot of the Cross when Jesus was being crucified). You, also, can take up Our Lady's call to wear her medal, as Father Dennis will be giving blessed medals to all at the Liturgies this weekend.

Financial update; Bills paid last week:

- ✓ Eparchy \$6,126.30 for assessment, medical insurance, and retirement fund for August and September.
- ✓ Integrated Security Systems: \$408.00 for security/fire alarm system maintenance.
- ✓ Enders Island: \$60.00 for 3 people who were not in our original count.
- ✓ Landscaping: \$250.00 for fertilizer and mums.
- ✓ Maintenance: \$56.03 for cleaning supplies for church and church hall.
- ✓ Miscellaneous: \$70.14 for flowers for the Feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos and toilet paper and paper towels for church and church hall.
- ✓ Saint Elijah Day: \$130.00 for food and supplies for the barbeque.
- ✓ Eastern Christian Bulletin Service: \$94.00 for weekly bulletin covers.

Total bills paid the last week: \$7,194.47 Total collected last week \$1,125.00. We had deficit last week of \$6,069.47. For the Fiscal Year, which began September 1, 2023 we have a deficit of \$3,584.47 in three weeks. Our spectrum of donations on a regular basis runs from \$3.00 per week to \$100.00 per week. The parishioners giving toward the higher end of the range are not necessarily the wealthiest, but they have made a commitment to God to give back a larger portion of their finances. It all belongs to God anyway! "One person gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty." This is the word of God from Proverbs: Chapter 11, verse 24. Almsgiving is a very serious matter to God, and a basic obligation of all Christians.

All donations for memorials, baptisms, marriages, priest stole offerings, and funerals are included in the collection total. **Father Dennis does not personally accept money for the Sacraments.**

Note: Gilbert Shasha donated \$1,000 last Sunday and Gil and his sisters, Mary and Judy, donated \$250 for Judy's husband's memorial Liturgy. Without their generosity, we would have only collected \$621.00, excluding candle donations. Please consider tithing. That way we will not need to rely on extra events to support our church.
