Twins, doctors, miracle workers: meet Saints Cosmas and Damian: Who were these saintly brothers? Cosmas and Damien were two brothers living in what is now Saudi Arabia during the reign of Emperor Diocletian (284-305 A. D.) and his terrible persecution of the early Christians. They studied medicine and practiced together.

They were supernaturally skilled and developed an outstanding reputation due to their remarkable gifts. Practicing medicine, free of charge, they became known as the "Moneyless Ones" or *Anargyroi*, in the eastern Church.

Desiring to heal more than bodies, they shared their belief in Christ with their patients while ministering to their health needs. They also prayed for, and with, their patients. Cooperating with God's grace, they brought about healings many considered miraculous. Renowned for their work in healing bodies and souls, they caught the attention of Lysias, the Roman governor. He ordered their capture and condemned them to death. Ancient Church histories record that they wee first cast into the sea with their three brother: Anthimus, Euprepius, and Leonitus. An angel is said to have saved them by delivering them safely to shore. Later the twins were burned, stoned, and shot with arrows, and yet remained unharmed and refused to renounce Christ.

Finally, executioners beheaded Cosmas and Damien, when they realized that they could not force the faithful brothers to abandon their faith. Eventually, Christians built a church over the burial site in the city of Cyrrhus, in what is now Syria. When Roman Emperor Justinian became ill, he prayed to the brothers for a cure. Upon receiving this favor, he enlarged the city and the church in their honor.

In honor of these Saints, we will have a Liturgy on their Feast Day and a healing service. This will occur on November 1 at 5:30 pm. This day is also the seven year anniversary of death of Lisa and my son, Matthew. This idea was proposed to me by Subdeacon Paul. Father Dennis

Financial update; Bills paid last week:

- U.S. Bank Equipment Finance: \$579.72 for 3 months
- Frontier: \$258.14 for cable, landline and internet.
- Eversource: \$556.30 for electricity for church, church hall, rectory, barn, and outside night lighting.

Total bills paid the last week: \$1,394.16 Total collected last week \$1,644.00. We had a surplus last week of \$249.84. For the Fiscal Year, which began September 1, 2023 we have a deficit of \$3,334.63 in four weeks. Our spectrum of donations on a regular basis runs from \$3.00 per week to \$100.00 per week. The parishioners giving toward the higher end of the range are not necessarily the wealthiest, but they have made a commitment to God to give back a larger portion of their finances. It all belongs to God anyway! "One person gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty." This is the word of God from Proverbs: Chapter 11, verse 24. Almsgiving is a very serious matter to God, and a basic obligation of all Christians.

All donations for memorials, baptisms, marriages, priest stole offerings, and funerals are included in the collection total. **Father Dennis does not personally accept money for the Sacraments.**

Please consider tithing. That way we will not need to rely on extra events to support our church. For example, if you make \$50,000 per year, the tithe would be \$5,000. If you gave 5%, you would contribute \$2,500 per year. Thanks, Father Dennis.
