Religious Education for adults: Beginning in November, we will have religious education for adults. This will be one hour beginning at 5:30 PM, and it will be held on the Wednesdays that we do not have the Rosary. The Rosary is prayed on the second and last Wednesday of each Month at 5:30 PM. Please sign up on the sheet on the table in the back of the church, if you will attend these classes.

Parish Advisory Council: We will have elections for the parish council, as we are overdue for that. We will need six positions. If you are interested in being on the council, please sign up on the sheet on the table in the back of the church. The election will take place on the weekend of 21 and 22 September. Current Parish Advisory Council members are still eligible to sign up.

Coffee Hour: The list to provide snacks for Sunday coffee hour, after Liturgy, is on the table in the rear of the church.

Hall Floor: The Hall floor is going to undergo a face-lift. Don't worry; it is not costing the parish anything. The floor has not been attended to for at least 8 years, other than mopping and sweeping. We have a company that is going to strip the floor, encase it in a state of the art polymer, and then buff it. They will also come back in three months to maintain the shine. The four separate Alcoholics Anonymous groups, which we host, are paying \$ 1,700.00 towards the cost. Father Dennis and Lisa are donating \$500.00 towards the cost. The project will start on September 16 and end on September 19.

Important Fact: Let us assume you are awake for 16 hours a day. You sleep for 8 hours. We have 52 weekends a year, where we celebrate the Divine Liturgy and 13 Holy Feast Days. Each Liturgy lasts about an hour and fifteen minutes. Should you attend every weekend Liturgy and every Feast Day Liturgy, you will spend 81 hours in church for the year. That amounts to only 3.38 days that you will spend in church. That amounts to only .01% of your time. This is not even close to1% of your time that the church asks you to devote to God. It is hard to justify that one does not have enough time to attend services.

Bishop's Appeal: The 2024 Bishop's Appeal drive has begun. Our goal this year is \$7,500.00. In 2022, our goal was \$6,000.00. We exceeded our goal by giving \$6,328.00. In 2023, we never received our goal. We collected \$720.00. Our goal for 2024 is \$7,500.00. Father Dennis and Lisa have already mailed their check for \$500.00 to the Eparchy. That leaves us with needing to collect another \$7,000.00. We have 40 people in the parish who donate on the weekend on a regular or semi-regular basis. If those people donated \$175.00, we would achieve our goal. The appeal ends on December 31, 2024. If you give \$43.75 in September, October, November, and December we will reach our goal. Weekly, starting next week, that would amount to \$12.50 per week over the 14 week period. You will soon receive a letter from the Bishop, which explains all.

When you send money, make sure you put in the memo potion of your check: Saint Ann, Waterford, CT.

An Inspiring Encounter: On Monday, September 9, I walked out the front door of the church to check the Clothing Shed in the early evening. I saw to my left in the garden area (the one with the purple leaved tree) a man working there finishing up his weeding of the garden and a huge pile of weeds on the sidewalk. I had been meaning to weed that area, but just have not had the time to do it. His name is Wayne and he attends our Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, which we host in our Hall. I thanked him profusely and he just said, "No problem, it is the least I can do". I asked him what he meant and why he took the time and effort to weed a garden at a church he does not even attend. He looked at me, with sweat dripping down his face and said, "This church provides a safe place for many recovering alcoholics. I park right next to this garden almost every day, while I attend meetings. I found a new life here and I bring struggling people to the meetings in the hall. This place brings me peace and I want it to look good. The garden was a mess and it was driving me crazy, so I weeded it!" Incidentally, Wayne was raised Catholic, but stopped believing many years ago. When he heard that I walked the Camino de Santiago in June, he asked me many questions about my experience. I was surprised when he told me he had booked his Camino. Upon his return, I asked him what it was like for him. He told me he could not explain it, but something moved him deeply. He is considering attending Mass at his old church, Saint Joseph, in New London. Thank you Wayne for the work on our garden, and may God move you to come home to the Catholic Church---Father Dennis
